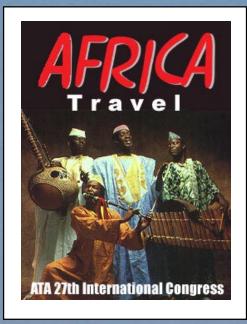
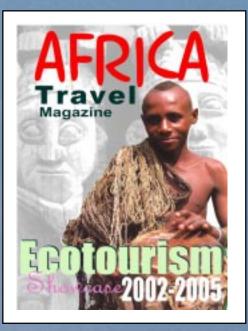

## **The International Year of Ecotourism**



Conakry, Guinea hosts Africa Travel Association 27th International Congress, April 28- May 3, 2002 Featured exclusively in Africa Travel Magazine

Conakry, Guinea will be the venue for the 27th International Congress of the Africa Travel Association, April 28-May 3, 2002, hosted by the Hon. Sylla Hadja Koumba Diakite (right), Minister of Tourism, Hotels and Handicraft. Mira Berman, ATA Executive Director, said that the dates were made to immediately follow the World Tourism Organizations, Commission on Africa meeting in neighboring Nigeria. The Novotel's Grand Hotel de l'Independance will serve as the ATA Congress Headquarters Hotel.

Guinea, situated on the West Coast of Africa, is 245,857 square miles with a population of 7.2 million. French is the official language. It has a tropical climate with the dry season from November to May and the rainy season from May to November. The Capital, Conakry, is a bustling port city on the Atlantic Ocean. The 12 story, seaside, Novotel Grand Hotel de l'Independence, has 214 air



conditioned rooms and 10 suites, offering a beautiful view of the lighthouse.

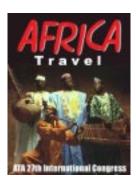
Part of UNESCO'S historic "Slave Route," Guinea was the first country to benefit from the program of rebuilding the historic sites on the "Slave Route." On Host Country Day, ATA delegates will have the opportunity to discover Guinea's "unspoiled Africa." The full day tour, sponsored by the private sector, the Office Of Promotion of Private Investment, will take Congress participants on a scenic tour to Kindia, including a visit to Konkoure Falls and a festive luncheon at a private ranch belonging to the sponsor of Host Day, El Hadj Mamadou Sylla. Highlight of the day will be a special performance in the evening at a Gala Dinner, by Guinee's world renowned **National Dance Company, Les Ballets Africains**.

The Congress registration fee, which includes five nights hotel accommodation at the four - star Novotel Grand Hotel de L,Independance, breakfast, all meals and activities listed in the congress program and the Host Day Activities, \$725 double (per person); \$925 single. Delegates must be an ATA member in good standing in order to qualify and register for the Congress. Special air fares are being negotiated for delegates. 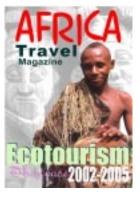
usual, many VIPs, including African Tourism Ministers will participate. Our circulation's focus is on 'decision makers,' people who influence large groups, even entire countries.

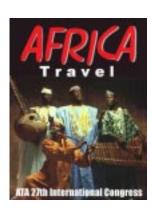
