Senegalese Prime Minister Opens ATA's 36th Annual World Congress in Dakar

May 25 – Honorable **Souleymane Ndéné Ndiaye**, the Prime Minister of Senegal, opened the Africa Travel Association's 36th Annual Congress this afternoon at Le Méridien President hotel in Dakar . Senegal is the host of ATA's hallmark event dedicated to bringing together tourism leaders and professionals to shape the present and future of Africa 's travel industry.

Visitor Arrivals to Africa Continue to Grow at Higher Rate than Overall Arrivals Worldwide

May 25 – ATA announced the forthcoming release of the second edition of the *State of Tourism in Africa* report, prepared by Africa House- New York University, the World Bank and ATA. The report, which uses facts, figures and stories to show the potential and impact of tourism across Africa, will be officially released at ATA's upcoming Presidential Forum on Africa Tourism in September, parallel to the

meetings of the United Nations General Assembly.

Citing UNWTO data, among other sources such as WTTC, China Tourism Academy, World Economic Forum, and Expedia, Inc., the report presents the preliminary finding that Africa's tourism arrivals grew from 37 million in 2003 to 63 million in 2010 and that arrivals to Africa continued to grow at a higher rate than overall arrivals in the world in 2010. In addition, according to the China Tourism Academy, Africa received 730,000 visitors from China in 2010, making it the smallest, but fastest growing continental destination with a growth rate of 90% in comparison to 2009.
