

The 36th ATA World Congress which just concluded in Dakar, Senegal provided an insight to Africa's tourism. The 2011 "State of Tourism in Africa" economic report prepared by the World Bank, ATA and NYU was reviewed and will be officially published as part of ATA's Presidential Forum being held in

September in conjunctions with the U.N. General Assembly meetings, provided the numbers for 2010 and an enthusiastic outlook for the coming year. The other side of Africa's tourism —primarily the Mediterranean Africa—Tunis and Egypt need all the travel and tourism industry's support to assist in their recovery. Libya was privately discussed, with the hope of resolving the situation that brought tourism to a stand still and continues to affect the regional business.


