The 36th ATA World Congress which just concluded in Dakar, Senegal provided an insight to Africa's tourism. The 2011 "State of Tourism in Africa" economic report prepared by the World Bank, ATA and NYU was reviewed and will be officially published as part of ATA's Presidential Forum being held in

September in conjunctions with the U.N. General Assembly meetings, provided the numbers for 2010 and an enthusiastic outlook for the coming year. The other side of Africa's tourism—primarily the Mediterranean Africa—Tunis and Egypt need all the travel and tourism industry's support to assist in their recovery. Libya was privately discussed, with the hope of resolving the situation that brought tourism to a stand still and continues to affect the regional business.

The SoCalATA Congress delegation was headed by the SoCalATA President Michael Madison, who participated in one of the key seminar/workshops "Working with Tour Operators on both sides of the Atlantic" and SoCalATA Board Member, Ron Mracky was honored with the ATA's 2011 Founders Award.

Overall, and as at all the ATA Congresses the tourism and travel business matters discussed are paramount to the development of the industry and issues that affect the front-line travel agents, tour operators, airlines, cruise lines, hotel brands and resorts. The Tourism Ministers and their staffs are among the attendees and "rub shoulders" and debate and work side-by-side with all the delegates. This is where much work and business is done—new destinations announced, new hotel openings and new upgrades to historical and eco sites propagated. In short—*if you are part of the Africa tourism and travel business, on either side of the Atlantic, you should be attending the ATA World Congresses!*

The Republic of CHAD—During the ATA Congress the Government of Chad has joined and became one of the ATA member countries. This is an initial foray by Chad into the international tourism arena.

NTA—National Tour Association President, Lisa Simon and ATA have signed a joint business agreement MOU to work in alliance in promotion of general tourism and specifically provide the Africa connection to the NTA tour operator members.

The SoCal travel agent and tour operator community continues to provide the largest number of leisure travelers to every one of Africa's tourist destinations.

The Africa portion of California's travel business keeps growing. In all of the Africa destinations Southern California provides the largest percentage of U.S. incoming tourists—in most cases from 25 % to 50% of the totals (*Tanzania 50+%, Egypt 27%*).

The most startling revelation reported in various industry reports is that Africa receives more tourists than the Caribbean, Central America and South America combined.

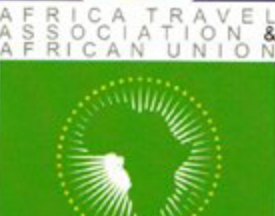
