Then there is MSC Starlight Cruises sailing out of Durban, South Africa. Although at low-profile in the U.S. market, they are operating scheduled cruises in the south African waters - a perfect product for the America safari market, e.g. from LA fly to SA – take a 3 or 4-day safari stay at Sabi Sands and hop on a cruise to relax and explore Africa.. And of course the two West Africa "regulars" - the Variety Cruises with

a weekly West Africa River Cruises, operating out of Dakar, Senegal

every Friday (Dec-April), and the Travel Dynamics International with their great selections of West Africa coastal cruises. These are in addition to the traditional Egyptian cruise products, such as the Viking River Cruises and others on the Nile and the Red Sea. These continue to be popular and established a level of market interest for Africa

cruising. African Mediterranean, cruises are on a bit of a hold, however after the political issues stabilize our efforts addressing moving some of the existing European Mediterranean cruise business to the waters of the African Mediterranean will resume. The major international cruise lines are including Africa in their itineraries and some are starting to integrate

scheduled sailings from and to African ports – all are welcomed as new business and products to sell.
